What protestors were calling for this

International Workers' Day

Where in the world? Also known as May Day or Labour Day, International Workers' Day was established in 1889, three years after the Chicago Haymarket riots demanded an 8-hour workday, <u>according to</u> <u>NPR</u>. More than 130 years later, people around the world still gather on May 1 to highlight the plight of workers.

# **RECRUITMENT & RETENTION**

#### Deflated, but not defeated

What's happening? The US economy added fewer jobs than expected last month, and fewer jobs than the average over the last 12 months. But economists say the job market is <u>still strong</u>. Total nonfarm payroll employment increased by 175,000 in April, well below the 303,000 <u>in March</u> and the 242,000 monthly average over the last year. The gains fell short of the <u>232,500 economists' forecast</u>.

<u>US government changes race categories</u> on EEOC forms

What's different? The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) <u>issued new guidance</u> last month for collecting and analyzing race and ethnicity data in hopes of assessing the US population more accurately.

First, there's a new category, called MENA (short for Middle Eastern and North African). Until now, the racial choices have been white, Black, Asian, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, and American Indian/Alaska Native.
